Red Ribbon Week is Oct. 23——31, and this year's theme is *Be Kind to Your Mind*. RISD Counseling and Prevention Programming will support campuses during Red Ribbon Week with the following resources:

ELEMENTARY CAMPUSES:

- Substance Use Prevention lessons in Health and P.E. and Health TEKS K-12.
- Presentations on refusal skills and healthy decision-making provided by high school peer helpers and peer mediators.
- Counselor-lead lessons include substance abuse prevention (Too Good For Drugs lessons in grades 4-6), bullying prevention, personal safety, and healthy coping skills.

SECONDARY CAMPUSES:

- The first ever The More You Know week (Oct 23-31) will feature Stanford Medicine's lessons on the harmful effects of marijuana and THC during advisory.
- Bullying prevention lessons also provided during advisory.
- Students have the opportunity to utilize peer mediation to resolve conflicts peacefully. Please check with campus counselors or administrators for more information.
