January 2029


Ribbon Cutting for the new Eagle Field

August 2028

Start Construction New Stadium

Continuing facility priority to provide adequate offseason training and skill development.



RHS Facility Priority

Current Stadium off-line, additional storage, duplicate equipment from field, portable mounds, batting cages, summer camp locations, creative scheduling to create space for all programs at RHS.


Est Jan 2026
